Across the team various choirs will be gearing up for Christmas. One of the key features of a choir is the opportunity to sing in harmony. Belting out the tune is one thing, but adding an alto, a tenor and a bass line, or maybe the descant when we get to "Sing choirs of angels" transforms the whole song. It is hard to do, because you have to stick to your part and not revert to what everyone else is doing, but boy is it worth it.

Singing in harmony is not the same as singing from the same hymn sheet, to coin a well-known cliché, or singing in unison: the whole point is that people have different parts according to their vocal range: they are not singing the same tune but they are singing the same piece. Harmony depends on each part singing its own tune according to the intention of the composer.

I am sure you can see where this is going. "May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another... so that together with one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ" says St Paul in a reading set for today. Harmony in a family, a church, a team depends on each person steadfastly singing their tune while listening to what everyone else is singing and understanding their part as a contribution to the whole. Only then can we make beautiful music together.
