

Fifth Sunday of Easter 10th May 2020

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The reading from Acts tells the story of the death of Stephen, the first Christian martyr. He had been arrested by people who were jealous of him and when he was put on trial he pulled no punches in testifying to what he believed. He knew that there are some things more important than life or death. "The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the church" said Tertullian and the Luke records that the people stoning Stephen laid their cloaks at the feet of a young man named Saul.

"Because your love is better than life, my lips will glorify you." runs Psalm 63. The story of Stephen and all the martyrs who followed him puts life into context: it is important but there are some things more important still. This weekend's celebration of VE day reminds us of those who put their lives on the line for others back then and those who still do so today and calls us to put our own priorities in order.
