This Sunday the epistle readings change from Philippians to Thessalonians and it is noticeable that St Paul begins the new as he ends the old. He has called the Philippians his joy and his crown, now he tells the Thessalonians how immensely proud he is of them. These are not just words of encouragement; these people are his life's work: his legacy. They are living testimony to the truth of the Gospel.

In a previous parish I was asked to take the funeral of a man who had died in his 70s. He was married and had two sons. I went round to the house to talk about the service and after a while I asked them to tell me something about their husband and father. There was a long silence as they tried to think of something notable they could say about him. At last the older one said "Well, he liked his telly."

It is a good idea every so often to think about our legacy: the imprint our life will leave on the world after we have gone. Most of us won't write books or found charities or invent new technologies but hopefully there will be more to say about us than that we liked to watch TV. Our legacy will be the impact we have on the lives of others and it is never too late to make that investment. In large or small ways we can be an example of the three things that last forever: faith, hope and love. That will be our joy and our crown.
